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Galatians

Paul's Greeting to the Galatians

1 Paul, an apostle—sent not from men nor by man, but by Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised Him from the dead—² and all the brothers with me,

To the churches of Galatia:

³Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,^{*a*} ⁴who gave Himself for our sins to **rescue** us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, ⁵to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

No Other Gospel

⁶I am **amazed** how **quickly** you are **deserting** the One who called you by the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—⁷ which is not even a gospel. **Evidently** some people are troubling you and trying to **distort** the gospel of Christ.

⁸But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be under a curse! ⁹As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be under a curse!

6 | Galatians 1:10

Paul Preaches the Gospel

¹⁰Am I now seeking the **approval** of men, or of God? Or am I striving to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a servant of Christ. ¹¹For I **certify** to you, brothers, that the gospel I preached was not **devised** by man.^{*a*} ¹² I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ.

¹³For you have heard of my former way of life in Judaism, how **severely** I persecuted the church of God and tried to destroy it. ¹⁴I was **advancing** in Judaism **beyond** many of my **contemporaries** and was **extremely** zealous for the **traditions** of my fathers.

¹⁵ But when God, who set me **apart** from my **mother's womb** and called me by His grace, was pleased ¹⁶ to reveal His Son in me so that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not **rush** to **consult** with flesh and blood, ¹⁷ nor did I go up to Jerusalem to the apostles who came before me, but I went into Arabia and later **returned** to **Damascus**.

¹⁸Only after three years did I go up to Jerusalem to confer with Cephas,^b and I stayed with him fifteen days. ¹⁹But I saw none of the other apostles except James, the Lord's brother.
²⁰I assure you before God that what I am writing to you is no lie.

²¹Later I went to the **regions** of **Syria** and **Cilicia**. ²²I was **personally unknown**, however, to the churches of **Judea** that are in Christ. ²³They only heard the account: "The man who formerly persecuted us is now preaching the faith he once tried to destroy." ²⁴And they **glorified** God because of me.

The Council at Jerusalem

2 Fourteen years later I went up again to Jerusalem, accompanied by Barnabas. I took Titus along also. ²I went in **response** to a revelation and set before them the gospel that I preach among the Gentiles. But I **spoke privately** to those **recognized** as leaders, for fear that I was running or had already run in vain. ³Yet not even Titus, who was with me, was **compelled** to be circumcised, even though he was a Greek.

⁴This issue **arose** because some false brothers had come in under false **pretenses** to **spy** on our freedom in Christ Jesus, in order to **enslave** us. ⁵We did not give in to them for a **moment**, so that the truth of the gospel would remain with you.

⁶But as for the **highly esteemed**—whatever they were **makes** no **difference** to me; God does not show favoritism^{*a*}— those leaders added nothing to me. ⁷On the contrary, they saw that I had been **entrusted** to preach the gospel to the uncircumcised, just as **Peter** had been to the circumcised. ⁸For the One who was at work in **Peter's** apostleship to the circumcised was also at work in my apostleship to the Gentiles.

⁹And **recognizing** the grace that I had been given, James, Cephas,^b and **John**—those **reputed** to be **pillars**—gave me and Barnabas the right hand of fellowship, so that we should go to the Gentiles, and they to the circumcised. ¹⁰They only **asked** us to remember the **poor**, the very thing I was eager to do.

8 | Galatians 2:11

Paul Confronts Cephas

¹¹When Cephas came to **Antioch**, however, I opposed him to his face, because he stood to be **condemned**. ¹²For before **certain** men came from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles. But when they **arrived**, he began to **draw** back and separate himself, for fear of those in the circumcision **group**. ¹³The other Jews **joined** him in his hypocrisy, so that by their hypocrisy even Barnabas was led **astray**.

¹⁴When I saw that they were not **walking** in **line** with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas in **front** of them all, "If you, who are a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?"^{*a*}

¹⁵We who are Jews by **birth** and not Gentile "sinners" ¹⁶know that a man is not justified by works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have believed in Christ Jesus, that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.

¹⁷But if, while we **seek** to be justified in Christ, we **ourselves** are found to be sinners, does that make Christ a minister of sin? Certainly not! ¹⁸If I **rebuild** what I have already torn down, I prove myself to be a **lawbreaker**.

¹⁹For through the law I died to the law so that I might live to God. ²⁰I have been crucified with Christ, and I no longer live, but Christ **lives** in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me. ²¹I do not set aside the grace of God. For if righteousness comes through the law, Christ died for nothing.

Faith and Belief

3 O foolish **Galatians**! Who has **bewitched** you? Before your very eyes Jesus Christ was clearly **portrayed** as crucified. ²I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you receive the Spirit by works of the law, or by **hearing** with faith?

³Are you so foolish? After **starting** in the Spirit, are you now **finishing** in the flesh? ⁴Have you **suffered** so much for nothing, if it **really** was for nothing? ⁵Does God **lavish** His Spirit on you and work **miracles** among you because you practice the law, or because you hear and believe?

⁶So also, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness."^{*a* 7}Understand, then, that those who have faith are sons of Abraham. ⁸The Scripture **foresaw** that God would **justify** the Gentiles by faith, and **foretold** the gospel to Abraham: "All **nations** will be blessed through you."^{*b*} ⁹So those who have faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.

Christ Has Redeemed Us

¹⁰All who **rely** on works of the law are under a curse. For it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law."^c ¹¹Now it is clear that no one is justified before God by the law, because, "The **righteous** will live by faith."^d ¹²The law, however, is not based on faith; on the contrary, "The man who does these things will live by them."^e

10 | Galatians 3:13

¹³Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by **becoming** a curse for us. For it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is **hung** on a **tree**."^{*a*} ¹⁴He redeemed us in order that the blessing promised to Abraham^{*b*} would come to the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit.

The Purpose of the Law

¹⁵Brothers, let me put this in human terms. Even a human covenant, once it is ratified, cannot be canceled or amended.
¹⁶The promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. The Scripture does not say, "and to seeds," meaning many, but "and to your seed,"^c meaning One, who is Christ.

¹⁷What I mean is this: The law that came **430** years later does not **revoke** the covenant **previously** established by God, so as to **nullify** the promise. ¹⁸For if the inheritance depends on the law, then it no longer depends on a promise; but God freely granted it to Abraham through a promise.

¹⁹Why then was the law given? It was added because of **transgressions**, until the **arrival** of the seed to whom the promise **referred**. It was **administered** through angels by a mediator. ²⁰A mediator is **unnecessary**, however, for only one **party**; but God is one.

²¹Is the law, then, opposed to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could **impart** life, then righteousness would certainly have come from the law. ²²But the Scripture **pronounces** all things **confined** by sin, so that by faith in Jesus Christ the promise might be given to those who believe.

²³Before this faith came, we were held in **custody** under the law, **locked** up until faith should be revealed. ²⁴So the law became our guardian to **lead** us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵Now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian.

Sons through Faith in Christ

²⁶You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. ²⁷For all of you who were **baptized** into Christ have **clothed** yourselves with Christ. ²⁸There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, **male** nor **female**, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹And if you belong to Christ, then you are **Abraham's** seed and heirs according to the promise.

Sons and Heirs

4 What I am saying is that as long as the heir is a child, he is no different from a slave, although he is the **owner** of everything. ²He is subject to **guardians** and **trustees** until the **date** set by his father.

³So also, when we were children, we were enslaved under the **basic** principles^{*a*} of the world. ⁴But when the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵to **redeem** those under the law, that we might receive our adoption as sons. ⁶And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, **crying** out, "**Abba**, Father!" ⁷So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, you are also an heir through God.

12 | Galatians 4:8

Paul's Concern for the Galatians

8Formerly, when you did not know God, you were slaves to those who by nature are not gods. ⁹But now that you know God, or rather are known by God, how is it that you are turning back to those weak and worthless principles? Do you wish to be enslaved by them all over again? ¹⁰You are observing special days and months and seasons and years! ¹¹I fear for you, that my efforts for you may have been in vain. ¹²I beg you, brothers, become like me, for I became like you. You have done me no wrong.

¹³You know that it was because of an illness that I first preached the gospel to you. ¹⁴And although my illness was a **trial** to you, you did not **despise** or **reject** me. Instead, you **welcomed** me as if I were an angel of God, as if I were Christ Jesus Himself. ¹⁵What then has become of your blessing? For I can testify that, if it were **possible**, you would have torn out your eyes and given them to me. ¹⁶Have I now become your **enemy** by **telling** you the truth?

¹⁷Those people are zealous for you, but not in a good way. Instead, they want to **isolate** you from us, so that you may be zealous for them. ¹⁸Nevertheless, it is good to be zealous if it **serves** a **noble** purpose—at any time, and not only when I am with you.

¹⁹My children, for whom I am again in the pains of **childbirth** until Christ is **formed** in you, ²⁰how I wish I could be with you now and **change** my **tone**, because I am **perplexed** about you.

Hagar and Sarah

²¹Tell me, you who want to be under the law, do you not understand what the law says? ²² For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by the slave woman and the other by the free woman.^{*a*} ²³ His son by the slave woman was born according to the flesh, but his son by the free woman was born through the promise.

²⁴These things serve as **illustrations**, for the women **represent** two covenants. One covenant is from Mount Sinai and bears children into slavery: This is Hagar. ²⁵Now Hagar **stands** for Mount Sinai in Arabia and **corresponds** to the **present-day** Jerusalem, because she is in slavery with her children. ²⁶But the Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother. ²⁷For it is written:

"Rejoice, O barren woman, who bears no children; break forth and cry aloud, you who have never travailed; because more are the children of the desolate woman than of her who has a husband."b

²⁸Now you,^c brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise.
²⁹At that time, however, the son born by the flesh persecuted the son born by the Spirit. It is the same now.

³⁰But what does the Scripture say? "**Expel** the slave woman and her son, for the slave woman's son will never share in the inheritance with the free woman's son."^{*d*} ³¹Therefore,

brothers, we are not children of the slave woman, but of the free woman.

Freedom in Christ

5 It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not be **encumbered** once more by a **yoke** of slavery.

² Take **notice**: I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. ³ Again I testify to every man who **gets** himself circumcised that he is **obligated** to obey the whole law. ⁴You who are trying to be justified by the law have been **severed** from Christ; you have **fallen** away from grace.

⁵ But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the hope of righteousness. ⁶For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. All that **matters** is faith, **expressed** through love.

⁷You were running so well. Who has **obstructed** you from **obeying** the truth? ⁸Such **persuasion** does not come from the One who **calls** you. ⁹A **little leaven** works through the whole **batch** of **dough**. ¹⁰I am confident in the Lord that you will take no other view. The one who is troubling you will bear the **judgment**, whoever he may be.

¹¹Now, brothers, if I am still preaching circumcision, why am I still being persecuted? In that **case** the **offense** of the cross has been **abolished**. ¹²As for those who are **agitating** you, I wish they would **proceed** to **emasculate** themselves!

¹³For you, brothers, were called to freedom; but do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh. Rather, serve one another in love. ¹⁴The **entire** law is **fulfilled** in a **single** **decree**: "Love your neighbor as yourself."^{*a*} ¹⁵ But if you keep on **biting** and **devouring** one another, watch out, or you will be **consumed** by one another.

Walking by the Spirit

¹⁶So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not **gratify** the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷For the flesh **craves** what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are opposed to each other, so that you do not do what you want. ¹⁸But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

¹⁹The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity, and debauchery; ²⁰idolatry and sorcery; hatred, discord, jealousy, and rage; rivalries, divisions, factions, ²¹and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

²²But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, **faithfulness**, ²³gentleness, and **self-control**. Against such things there is no law.

²⁴Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its **passions** and desires. ²⁵Since we live by the Spirit, let us walk in **step** with the Spirit. ²⁶Let us not become **conceited**, **provoking** and **envying** one another.

Carry One Another's Burdens

6 Brothers, if someone is **caught** in a **trespass**, you who are spiritual should **restore** him with a spirit of gentleness. But watch yourself, or you also may be **tempted**. ²Carry

one **another's burdens**, and in this way you will **fulfill** the law of Christ.

³If anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he **de-ceives** himself.

⁴ Each one should test his own work. Then he will have reason to boast in himself **alone**, and not in someone else. ⁵ For each one should carry his own **load**. ⁶ Nevertheless, the one who **receives** instruction in the word must share in all good things with his **instructor**.

⁷Do not be **deceived**: God is not to be **mocked**. Whatever a man sows, he will reap in **return**. ⁸The one who sows to please his flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; but the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life.

⁹Let us not grow **weary** in **well-doing**, for in due time we will reap a **harvest** if we do not give up. ¹⁰Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to the family of faith.

Final Warnings and Blessings

¹¹See what **large letters** I am **using** to write to you with my own hand!

¹²Those who want to make a good **impression outwardly** are trying to compel you to be circumcised. They only do this to **avoid persecution** for the cross of Christ. ¹³For the circumcised do not even keep the law themselves, yet they want you to be circumcised that they may boast in your flesh.

¹⁴But as for me, may I never boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which^{*a*} the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision **means** anything. What **counts** is a new creation.

¹⁶Peace and mercy to all who walk by this rule, even to the Israel of God.

¹⁷From now on let no one **cause** me trouble, for I bear on my body the **marks** of Jesus.

¹⁸The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers.

Amen.

Ephesians

Paul's Greeting to the Ephesians

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God,

To the saints in **Ephesus**,^{*a*} the faithful in Christ Jesus:

²Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Spiritual Blessings

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly realms. ⁴For He **chose** us in Him before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless in His presence. In love ⁵He predestined us for adoption as His sons through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of His will, ⁶to the praise of His glorious grace, which He has freely given us in the Beloved One.

⁷In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace ⁸that He **lavished** on us with all wisdom and understanding. ⁹And He has made known to us the mystery of His will according to His good pleasure, which He **purposed** in Christ ¹⁰as a plan for the fullness of time, to bring all things in heaven and on earth together in Christ. ¹¹In Him we were also chosen as God's own, having been predestined according to the plan of Him who works out everything by the **counsel** of His will, ¹²in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, would be for the praise of His glory.

¹³And in Him, having heard and believed the word of truth the gospel of your salvation—you were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴who is the **pledge** of our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's **possession**, to the praise of His glory.

Spiritual Wisdom

¹⁵For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, ¹⁶I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, ¹⁷that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation in your knowledge of Him.

¹⁸I ask that the eyes of your heart^{*a*} may be **enlightened**, so that you may know the hope of His calling, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, ¹⁹ and the surpassing **greatness** of His power to us who believe. These are in **accordance** with the working of His mighty strength, ²⁰ which He **exerted** in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly realms, ²¹ far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is **named**, not only in the present age but also in the one to come.

²²And God put everything under His feet and made Him head over everything for the church, ²³which is His body, the fullness of Him who **fills** all in all.

20 | Ephesians 2:1

Alive with Christ

2 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, ²in which you used to walk when you conformed to the ways of this world and of the ruler of the power of the **air**, the spirit who is now at work in the sons of disobedience. ³All of us also lived among them at one time, **fulfilling** the **cravings** of our flesh and **indulging** its desires and **thoughts**. Like the rest, we were by nature children of wrath.

⁴But because of His great love for us, God, who is **rich** in mercy, ⁵made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in our trespasses. It is by grace you have been saved! ⁶And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with Him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷in order that in the coming ages He might **display** the surpassing riches of His grace, **demonstrated** by His kindness to us in Christ Jesus.

⁸For it is by grace you have been saved through faith, and this not from yourselves; it is the gift of God, ⁹not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰For we are God's **workmanship**, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God **prepared** in advance as our way of life.^{*a*}

One in Christ

¹¹Therefore remember that formerly you who are Gentiles in the flesh and called uncircumcised by the **so-called** circumcision (that done in the body by human hands)— ¹² remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, alienated from the **commonwealth** of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For He Himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has torn down the **dividing wall** of hostility ¹⁵ by **abolishing** in His flesh the law of **commandments** and decrees. He did this to **create** in Himself one new man out of the two, **thus** making peace ¹⁶ and **reconciling** both of them to God in one body through the cross, by which He **extinguished** their hostility.

¹⁷He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. ¹⁸For through Him we both have **access** to the Father by one Spirit.

Christ Our Cornerstone

¹⁹Therefore you are no longer strangers and **foreigners**, but fellow **citizens** with the saints and members of God's household, ²⁰built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus Himself as the **cornerstone**. ²¹In Him the whole building is fitted together and grows into a holy **temple** in the Lord. ²²And in Him you too are being built together into a **dwelling** place for God in His Spirit.

The Mystery of the Gospel

For this reason I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles... a

²Surely you have heard about the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written **briefly**. ⁴In **reading** this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵which was not made known to men in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. ⁶This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are

fellow heirs, fellow members of the body, and fellow partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus.

⁷I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace, given me through the working of His power. ⁸Though I am less than the **least** of all the saints, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the **unsearchable** riches of Christ, ⁹and to **illuminate** for everyone the stewardship^{*a*} of this mystery, which for ages **past** was **kept** hidden in God, who created all things. ¹⁰His purpose was that now, through the church, the **manifold** wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹according to the eternal purpose that He **accomplished** in Christ Jesus our Lord.

¹²In Him and through faith in Him^b we may **enter** God's presence with boldness and confidence. ¹³So I ask you not to be discouraged because of my sufferings for you, which are your glory.

Paul's Prayer for the Ephesians

¹⁴... for this reason I bow my **knees** before the Father,^c ¹⁵from whom every family in heaven and on earth **derives** its name. ¹⁶I ask that out of the riches of His glory He may **strengthen** you with power through His Spirit in your **inner** being, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. Then you, being rooted and **grounded** in love, ¹⁸will have power, together with all the saints, to **comprehend** the **length** and **width** and **height** and depth ¹⁹of the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Amen.

Unity in the Body

As a prisoner in the Lord, then, I urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling you have received: ²with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³and with **diligence** to **preserve** the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

⁴There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; ⁵one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

⁷Now to each one of us grace has been given according to the measure of the gift of Christ. ⁸This is why it says:^{*a*}

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"When He ascended on high,
He led captives away,
and gave gifts to men."<sup>b</sup>
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⁹What does "He ascended" mean, except that He also descended^{*c*} to the **lower parts** of the earth? ¹⁰He who descended is the very One who ascended above all the **heavens**, in order to fill all things.

¹¹And it was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be **evangelists**, and some to be **pastors** and **teachers**, ¹² to **equip** the saints for works of ministry and to **build** up the body of Christ, ¹³until we all **reach** unity in

the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God, as we mature to the full measure of the **stature** of Christ.

¹⁴Then we will no longer be **infants**, **tossed** about by the **waves** and **carried** around by every **wind** of teaching and by the **clever cunning** of men in their deceitful **scheming**. ¹⁵Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into Christ Himself, who is the head. ¹⁶From Him the whole body, fitted and held together by every **supporting ligament**, grows and **builds** itself up in love through the work of each **individual part**.

New Life in Christ

¹⁷So I tell you this, and **insist** on it in the Lord, that you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the **futility** of their **thinking**. ¹⁸They are **darkened** in their understanding and alienated from the life of God because of the **ignorance** that is in them due to the **hardness** of their hearts. ¹⁹Having lost all **sense** of shame, they have given themselves over to **sensuality** for the practice of every kind of impurity, with a **craving** for more.

²⁰But this is not the way you came to know Christ. ²¹Surely you heard of Him and were taught in Him—in **keeping** with the truth that is in Jesus—²² to put off your former way of life, your old self, which is being **corrupted** by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be renewed in the spirit of your minds; ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and **holiness**.

²⁵Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one another. ²⁶ "Be **angry**, yet do not sin." ^{*a*} Do not let the **sun** set upon your anger, ²⁷ and do not give the **devil** a **foothold**.

²⁸He who has been **stealing** must **steal** no longer, but must work, doing good with his own hands, that he may have something to share with the one in need.

²⁹Let no **unwholesome** talk come out of your **mouths**, but only what is **helpful** for building up the one in need and **bringing** grace to those who **listen**.

³⁰And do not **grieve** the Holy Spirit of God, in whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

³¹Get **rid** of all **bitterness**, rage and anger, **outcry** and slander, along with every form of malice. ³²Be kind and **tenderhearted** to one another, **forgiving** each other just as in Christ God forgave you.

Imitators of God

5 Be **imitators** of God, therefore, as beloved children, ² and walk in love, just as Christ loved us^b and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant **sacrificial** offering to God.

³But among you, as is proper among the saints, there must not be even a **hint** of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed. ⁴Nor should there be **obscenity**, foolish talk, or **crude joking**, which are out of **character**, but rather thanksgiving. ⁵For of this you can be sure: No **immoral**, **impure**, or **greedy** person (that is, an **idolater**), has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

26 | Ephesians 5:6

⁶Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of such things the wrath of God is coming on the sons of disobedience. ⁷Therefore do not be partakers with them.

Children of Light

⁸For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light, ⁹for the fruit of the light **consists** in all goodness, righteousness, and truth. ¹⁰Test and prove what **pleases** the Lord.

¹¹Have no fellowship with the **fruitless** deeds of darkness, but rather **expose** them. ¹²For it is **shameful** even to mention what the **disobedient** do in **secret**. ¹³But everything **exposed** by the light becomes visible,^{*a*} for everything that is **illuminated** becomes a light itself. ¹⁴So it is said:

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"Wake up, O sleeper,
rise up from the dead,
and Christ will shine on you."
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¹⁵Pay careful attention, then, to how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶ redeeming the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. ¹⁸Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to reckless indiscretion. Instead, be filled with the Spirit.

¹⁹Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make **music** in your hearts to the Lord, ²⁰always giving thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Wives and Husbands

²¹Submit to one another out of **reverence** for Christ.^b

²²Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. ²³For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, His body, of which He is the Savior. ²⁴Now as the church **submits** to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

²⁵Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her ²⁶to **sanctify** her, **cleansing** her by the **washing** with **water** through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to Himself as a glorious church, without **stain** or **wrinkle** or any such **blemish**, but holy and blameless.

²⁸In the same way, husbands **ought** to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹Indeed, no one ever **hated** his own body, but he **nourishes** and **cherishes** it, just as Christ does the church. ³⁰For we are members of His body.^a

³¹"For this reason a man will **leave** his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."^b ³²This mystery is **profound**, but I am speaking about Christ and the church. ³³Nevertheless, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

Children and Parents

6 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ²"Honor your father and mother" (which is the first **commandment** with a promise), ³"that it may go well with you and that you may have a long life on the earth."^{*c*}

⁴Fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath; instead, bring them up in the **discipline** and instruction of the Lord.

28 | Ephesians 6:5

Serving with Honor

⁵Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear and sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. ⁶And do this not only to please them while they are watching, but as servants of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. ⁷Serve with good will, as to the Lord and not to men, ⁸because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free.

⁹And masters, do the same for your slaves. Give up your use of **threats**, because you know that He who is both their Master and **yours** is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with Him.

The Full Armor of God

¹⁰Finally, be **strong** in the Lord and in His mighty power. ¹¹Put on the full armor of God, so that you can make your stand against the **devil's schemes**. ¹²For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this **world's** darkness, and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

¹³Therefore take up the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you will be able to stand your **ground**, and having done everything, to stand. ¹⁴Stand firm then, with the **belt** of truth **buckled** around your **waist**, with the **breastplate** of righteousness **arrayed**, ¹⁵and with your feet fitted with the **readiness** of the gospel of peace. ¹⁶In **addition** to all this, take up the **shield** of faith, with which you can **extinguish** all the **flaming arrows** of the evil one. ¹⁷And take the **helmet** of salvation and the **sword** of the Spirit, which is the word of God. ¹⁸Pray in the Spirit at all **times**, with every kind of prayer and petition. To this end, **stay alert** with all **perseverance** in your prayers for all the saints. ¹⁹Pray also for me, that **whenever** I open my **mouth**, words may be given me so that I will **boldly** make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰for which I am an **ambassador** in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it **fearlessly**, as I should.

Final Greetings

²¹Tychicus, the beloved brother and faithful servant in the Lord, will tell you everything, so that you also may know about me and what I am doing. ²²I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know about us, and that he may encourage your hearts.

²³Peace to the brothers and love with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

²⁴Grace to all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with an undying love.

Philippians

Greetings from Paul and Timothy

Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus,

To all the saints in Christ Jesus at **Philippi**, together with the **overseers** and **deacons**:

²Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Thanksgiving and Prayer

³I thank my God every time I remember you. ⁴In every prayer for all of you, I always pray with joy, ⁵because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, ⁶being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to **completion** until the day of Christ Jesus.

⁷ It is right for me to **feel** this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart. For in my chains and in my defense and **confirmation** of the gospel, you are all **partners** in grace with me. ⁸God is my **witness** how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus.

⁹And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, ¹⁰so that you may be able to test and prove what is **best** and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, ¹¹filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

Paul's Trials Advance the Gospel

¹²Now I want you to know, brothers, that my circumstances have **actually** served to advance the gospel. ¹³As a **result**, it has become clear throughout the whole **palace** guard^{*a*} and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. ¹⁴And **most** of the brothers, confident in the Lord by my chains, now **dare** more greatly to speak the word^{*b*} without fear.

¹⁵It is true that some preach Christ out of envy and **rivalry**, but others out of **goodwill**. ¹⁶The **latter** do so in love, knowing that I am **appointed** for the defense of the gospel.^c ¹⁷The former, however, preach Christ out of selfish ambition, not **sincerely**, **supposing** that they can **add** to the distress of my chains.

¹⁸What then is the issue?^d Just this: that in every way, whether by false **motives** or true, Christ is preached. And in this I rejoice. Yes, and I will continue to rejoice, ¹⁹because I know that through your prayers and the **provision** of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, my distress will turn out for my **deliverance**. ²⁰I eagerly **expect** and hope that I will in no way be **ashamed**, but will have complete boldness so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

To Live Is Christ

²¹For to me, to live is Christ, and to **die** is gain. ²²But if I go on **living** in the body, this will mean **fruitful** labor for me. So what

32 | Philippians 1:23

shall I choose? I do not know. ²³I am torn between the two. I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better indeed.
²⁴But it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body.

²⁵Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith,
²⁶so that through my coming to you again your exultation in Christ Jesus will resound on account of me.

Worthy of the Gospel

²⁷Nevertheless, **conduct** yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in one spirit, **contending** side by side^{*a*} for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸without being **frightened** in any way by those who **oppose** you. This is a clear **sign** of their destruction but of your salvation, and it is from God. ²⁹For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in Him, but also to **suffer** for Him, ³⁰since you are **encountering** the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.

One in Christ

2 Therefore if you have any encouragement in Christ, if any comfort from His love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, ²then make my joy complete by being **like-minded**, having the same love, being united in spirit and purpose.

³Do nothing out of selfish ambition or empty **pride**, but in humility consider others more **important** than yourselves. ⁴Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

The Mind of Christ

⁵Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus:

⁶Who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped,^a
⁷but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in human likeness.
⁸And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to death even death on a cross.

⁹Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name above all names,
¹⁰that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
¹¹and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord,

to the glory of God the Father.

Lights in the World

¹²Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always **obeyed**, not only in my presence, but now even more in my absence, continue to work out your salvation with fear and **trembling**.
¹³For it is God who works in you to will and to act on behalf of His good purpose.

¹⁴Do everything without **complaining** or **arguing**, ¹⁵ so that you may be blameless and pure, children of God without **fault**

34 | Philippians 2:16

in a **crooked** and **perverse generation**,^{*a*} in which you shine as **lights** the world ¹⁶ as you hold forth the word of life, in order that I may boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labor in vain.

¹⁷But even if I am being **poured** out like a drink offering on the sacrifice and service of your faith, I am glad and rejoice with all of you. ¹⁸So you too should be glad and rejoice with me.

Timothy and Epaphroditus

¹⁹Now I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, that I also may be **cheered** when I learn how you are doing. ²⁰I have **nobody** else like him who will **genuinely care** for your needs. ²¹For all the others look after their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. ²²But you know **Timothy's proven worth**, that as a child with his father he has served with me to advance the gospel. ²³So I hope to send him as soon as I see what **happens** with me. ²⁴And I **trust** in the Lord that I myself will come soon.

²⁵ But I **thought** it necessary to send back to you Epaphroditus, my brother, fellow worker, and fellow soldier, who is also your **messenger** and minister to my needs. ²⁶ For he has been **longing** for all of you and is **distressed** because you heard he was **ill**. ²⁷ He was **sick** indeed, nearly **unto** death. But God had mercy on him, and not only on him but also on me, to **spare** me sorrow upon sorrow.

²⁸Therefore I am all the more eager to send him, so that when you see him again you may rejoice, and I may be less anxious.
²⁹Welcome him in the Lord with great joy, and honor men

like him, ³⁰because he nearly died for the work of Christ, **risking** his life to make up for your **deficit** of service to me.

Righteousness through Faith in Christ

3 Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord. It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a **safeguard** for you.

²Watch out for those **dogs**, those workers of evil, those **mutilators** of the flesh! ³For it is we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh— ⁴though I myself could have such confidence.

If anyone else thinks he has **grounds** for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the **eighth** day, of the people of Israel, of the **tribe** of **Benjamin**; a **Hebrew** of **Hebrews**; as to the law, a **Pharisee**; ⁶ as to **zeal**, **persecuting** the church; as to righteousness in the law, faultless.

⁷ But whatever was gain to me I count as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸More than that, I count all things as loss **compared** to the surpassing **excellence** of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have lost all things. I consider them **rubbish**, that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ,^{*a*} the righteousness from God on the basis of faith.

¹⁰I want to know Christ and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to Him in His death, ¹¹and so, **somehow**, to **attain** to the resurrection from the dead.

36 | Philippians 3:12

Pressing on toward the Goal

¹²Not that I have already **obtained** all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: **Forgetting** what is **behind** and **straining** toward what is **ahead**, ¹⁴I press on toward the **goal** to **win** the **prize** of God's heavenly calling in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵All of us who are mature should **embrace** this **point** of view. And if you think **differently** about some issue, God will reveal this to you as well. ¹⁶Nevertheless, we must live up to what we have already **attained**.

Citizenship in Heaven

¹⁷Join one another in **following** my **example**, brothers, and **carefully observe** those who walk according to the **pattern** we set for you. ¹⁸For as I have **often told** you before, and now say again even with **tears**: Many live as **enemies** of the cross of Christ. ¹⁹Their end is destruction, their god is their **belly**, and their glory is in their shame. Their minds are set on earthly things.

²⁰But our citizenship is in heaven, and we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹who, by the power that enables Him to subject all things to Himself, will transform our lowly bodies to be like His glorious body.

Rejoice in the Lord

4 Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and **crown**, that is how you must stand firm in the Lord, my beloved.

²I urge **Euodia** and **Syntyche** to **agree** with each other in the Lord. ³Yes, and I ask you, my true **yokefellow**,^{*a*} to **help** these women who have **labored** with me for the gospel, along with **Clement** and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the Book of Life.

⁴Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵Let your gentleness be **apparent** to all. The Lord is near.

⁶Be anxious for nothing, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your **requests** to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

⁸Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is **honorable**, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is **lovely**, whatever is **admirable**—if anything is excellent or **praiseworthy**—think on these things. ⁹Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me, put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

The Generosity of the Philippians

¹⁰Now I rejoice greatly in the Lord that at **last** you have **revived** your **concern** for me. You were indeed **concerned**, but you had no opportunity to show it. ¹¹I am not saying this out of need, for I have learned to be **content regardless** of my circumstances. ¹²I know how to live **humbly**, and I know how to abound. I am **accustomed** to any and every **situation**—to being filled and being **hungry**, to having **plenty** and having need. ¹³I can do all things through Christ who **gives** me strength.^b

a 3 Or *I ask you, loyal Syzygus* **b** 13 NA, SBL, NE, and WH *in the One who gives me strength.* BYZ and TR *in Christ who gives me strength.*

38 | Philippians 4:14

¹⁴Nevertheless, you have done well to share in my **affliction**. ¹⁵And as you **Philippians** know, in the **early** days of the gospel, when I **left Macedonia**, no church but you **partnered** with me in the **matter** of giving and **receiving**. ¹⁶For even while I was in **Thessalonica**, you **provided** for my needs again and again.

¹⁷Not that I am seeking a gift, but I am **looking** for the fruit that may be credited to your account. ¹⁸I have all I need and more, now that I have received your gifts from Epaphroditus. They are a fragrant offering, an **acceptable** sacrifice, **wellpleasing** to God.

¹⁹And my God will supply all your needs according to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus. ²⁰To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen.

Final Greetings

²¹Greet all the saints in Christ Jesus.

The brothers who are with me send you greetings.

²²All the saints send you greetings, especially those from the household of **Caesar**.

²³The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.^{*a*}

Colossians

Greetings from Paul and Timothy

1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,

²To the saints and faithful brothers in Christ at **Colossae**:

Grace and peace to you from God our Father.^a

Thanksgiving and Prayer

³We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴because we have heard about your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all the saints— ⁵the faith and love **proceeding** from the hope **stored** up for you in heaven, of which you have already heard in the word of truth, the gospel ⁶that has come to you.

All over the world this gospel is bearing fruit and growing, just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and **truly understood** the grace of God. ⁷You learned it from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on our^b behalf, ⁸and who also **informed** us of your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped **praying** for you and **asking** God to fill you with

40 | Colossians 1:10

the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰so that you may walk in a manner worthy of the Lord and may please Him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹being **strengthened** with all power according to His glorious might so that you may have full **endurance** and patience, and **joyfully** ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has **qualified** you^{*a*} to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light.

¹³He has **rescued** us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of His beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption,^b the forgiveness of sins.

The Supremacy of the Son

¹⁵The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶For in Him all things were created, things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether **thrones** or **dominions** or rulers or authorities. All things were created through Him and for Him.

¹⁷He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. ¹⁸And He is the head of the body, the church; He is the **beginning** and firstborn from among the dead, so that in all things He may have **preeminence**. ¹⁹For God was pleased to have all His fullness dwell in Him, ²⁰and through Him to **reconcile** to Himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through the blood of His cross.

²¹Once you were alienated from God and were **hostile** in your minds, **engaging** in evil deeds. ²²But now He has **reconciled** you by Christ's **physical** body through death to

present you holy, **unblemished**, and blameless in His presence—²³ if indeed you continue in your faith, established and firm, not **moved** from the hope of the gospel you heard, which has been **proclaimed** to every **creature**^{*a*} under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant.

Paul's Suffering for the Church

²⁴Now I rejoice in my sufferings for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is **lacking** in regard to Christ's **afflictions** for the sake of His body, which is the church. ²⁵I became its servant by the **commission** God gave me to fully proclaim to you the word of God, ²⁶the mystery that was hidden for ages and generations but is now revealed to His saints. ²⁷To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.

²⁸We proclaim Him, **admonishing** and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone perfect^b in Christ. ²⁹To this end I also labor, striving with all His **energy** working **powerfully** within me.

Absent in Body, Present in Spirit

2 For I want you to know how much I am **struggling** for you and for those at Laodicea, and for all who have not **met** me face to face, ² that they may be **encouraged** in heart, knit together in love, and filled with the full riches of complete understanding, so that they may know the mystery of God, **namely** Christ,^c ³ in whom are hidden all the **treasures** of wisdom and knowledge.

42 | Colossians 2:4

⁴I say this so that no one will deceive you by **smooth rhetoric**. ⁵For although I am **absent** from you in body, I am present with you in spirit, and I **delight** to see your **orderly condition** and firm faith in Christ.

Alive with Christ

⁶Therefore, just as you have received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to walk in Him, ⁷rooted and built up in Him, established in the faith as you were taught, and **overflowing** with **thankfulness**.

⁸See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, which are based on human tradition and the spiritual forces of the world rather than on Christ. ⁹For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity dwells in bodily form. ¹⁰And you have been made complete in Christ, who is the head over every ruler and authority.

¹¹In Him you were also circumcised, in the **putting** off of your sinful nature, with the circumcision **performed** by Christ^{*a*} and not by human hands. ¹²And having been **buried** with Him in baptism, you were raised with Him through your faith in the power of God, who raised Him from the dead.

¹³When you were dead in your trespasses and in the uncircumcision of your sinful nature, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ having canceled the **debt ascribed** to us in the decrees that stood against us. He took it away, **nailing** it to the cross! ¹⁵And having **disarmed** the powers and authorities, He made a **public spectacle** of them, **triumphing** over them by the cross. ¹⁶Therefore let no one **judge** you by what you eat or drink, or with regard to a **feast**, a New **Moon**, or a **Sabbath**. ¹⁷These are a **shadow** of the things to come, but the body that **casts** it **belongs** to Christ.^{*a*} ¹⁸Do not let anyone who **delights** in false humility and the worship of angels **disqualify** you with **speculation** about what he has seen. Such a person is **puffed** up without basis by his **unspiritual** mind. ¹⁹He has lost **connection** to the head, from whom the whole body, **supported** and knit together by its **joints** and **ligaments**, grows as God **causes** it to grow.

²⁰If you have died with Christ to the spiritual forces of the world, why, as though you still belonged to the world, do you submit to its **regulations**: ²¹"Do not **handle**, do not **taste**, do not **touch**!"? ²²These will all **perish** with use, because they are based on human **commands** and **teachings**. ²³Such **restrictions** indeed have an appearance of wisdom, with their **self-prescribed** worship, their false humility, and their harsh **treatment** of the body; but they are of no value against the **indulgence** of the flesh.

Put On the New Self

3 Therefore, since you have been raised with Christ, **strive** for the things above, **where** Christ is seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. ³For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ, who is your^b life, **appears**, then you also will **appear** with Him in glory.

⁵Put to death, therefore, the **components** of your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, **lust**, evil desires, and greed, which is idolatry. ⁶Because of these, the wrath of God

44 | Colossians 3:7

is coming on the sons of disobedience.^{*a*} ⁷When you lived among them, you also used to walk in these ways. ⁸But now you must put aside all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and **filthy language** from your **lips**.

⁹Do not lie to one another, since you have taken off the old self with its **practices**, ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its **Creator**. ¹¹Here there is no Greek or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, **barbarian**, **Scythian**, slave, or free, but Christ is all and is in all.

¹²Therefore, as the **elect** of God, holy and beloved, **clothe** yourselves with hearts of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. ¹³Bear with one another and forgive any **complaint** you may have against someone else. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴And over all these **virtues** put on love, which is the bond of perfect unity. ¹⁵Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, for to this you were called as members of one body. And be thankful.

¹⁶Let the word of Christ **richly** dwell within you as you **teach** and **admonish** one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with **gratitude** in your hearts to God. ¹⁷And whatever you do, in word or **deed**, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

Christian Households

¹⁸Wives, submit to your husbands, as is **fitting** in the Lord.

¹⁹Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them.

²⁰Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is **pleasing** to the Lord.

²¹Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they will not become discouraged.

Serving with Honor

²²Slaves, obey your earthly masters in everything, not only to please them while they are watching, but with sincerity of heart and fear of the Lord.

²³Whatever you do, work at it with your whole being, for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴because you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as your reward. It is the Lord Christ you are **serving**. ²⁵Whoever does wrong will be **repaid** for his wrong, and there is no favoritism.

Prayerful Speech and Actions

4 Masters, supply your slaves with what is right and **fair**, since you know that you also have a Master in heaven.

²**Devote** yourselves to prayer, being **watchful** and thankful, ³as you pray also for us, that God may open to us a **door** for the word, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. ⁴Pray that I may **declare** it clearly, as I should.

⁵ Act **wisely** toward **outsiders**, redeeming the time. ⁶ Let your **speech** always be **gracious**, **seasoned** with **salt**, so that you may know how to **answer** everyone.

Greetings from Paul's Fellow Workers

⁷Tychicus will tell you all the **news** about me. He is a beloved brother, a faithful minister, and a fellow servant in the Lord.
⁸I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know about us, and that he may encourage your hearts.
⁹With him I am sending Onesimus, our faithful and beloved

brother, who is one of you. They will tell you about everything here.

¹⁰My fellow prisoner Aristarchus sends you greetings, as does Mark the **cousin** of Barnabas. You have already received **instructions** about him: If he comes to you, welcome him. ¹¹Jesus, who is called **Justus**, also sends greetings. These are the only Jews among my fellow workers for the kingdom of God, and they have been a comfort to me.

¹²Epaphras, who is one of you and a servant of Christ Jesus, sends you greetings. He is always **wrestling** in prayer for you, so that you may stand mature and fully **assured** in the full will of God. ¹³For I testify about him that he **goes** to great pains for you and for those at Laodicea and **Hierapolis**.

¹⁴Luke, the beloved **physician**, and Demas send you greetings.

Signature and Final Instructions

¹⁵Greet the brothers in Laodicea, as well as **Nympha** and the church that meets at her house.

¹⁶After this letter has been read among you, make sure that it is also read in the church of the **Laodiceans**, and that you in turn read the letter from Laodicea.

¹⁷Tell Archippus: "See to it that you complete the ministry you have received in the Lord."

¹⁸This **greeting** is in my own hand—Paul.

Greetings from Paul and Timothy

¹Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

To **Philemon** our beloved fellow worker, ² to **Apphia** our **sister**, to Archippus our fellow soldier, and to the church that meets at your^{*a*} house:

³Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Philemon's Faith and Love

⁴I always thank my God, remembering you in my prayers, ⁵because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints. ⁶I pray that your partnership in the faith may become **effective** as you fully **acknowledge** every good thing that is **ours** in Christ. ⁷I take great joy and encouragement in your love, because you, brother, have **refreshed** the hearts of the saints.

Paul's Appeal for Onesimus

⁸So although in Christ I am **bold enough** to order you to do what is proper, ⁹I **prefer** to appeal on the basis of love. For I, Paul, am now **aged**, and a prisoner of Christ Jesus as well.

¹⁰I appeal to you for my child Onesimus,^b whose father I became while I was in chains. ¹¹Formerly he was **useless** to

you, but now he has become **useful** both to you and to me. ¹²I am sending back to you him who is my very heart.

¹³I would have **liked** to keep him with me, so that on your behalf he could minister to me in my chains for the gospel. ¹⁴But I did not want to do anything without your **consent**, so that your goodness will not be out of **compulsion**, but by your own free will. ¹⁵For **perhaps** this is why he was **separated** from you for a while, so that you might have him back for good— ¹⁶no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a beloved brother. He is especially beloved to me, but even more so to you, both in person and in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me a **partner**, receive him as you would receive me. ¹⁸But if he has **wronged** you in any way or **owes** you anything, **charge** it to my account. ¹⁹I, Paul, write this with my own hand. I will **repay** it—not to mention that you **owe** me your very self.

²⁰Yes, brother, let me have some **benefit**^a from you in the Lord. **Refresh** my heart in Christ.

²¹Confident of your **obedience**, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

²²In the **meantime**, **prepare** a **guest room** for me, because I hope that through your prayers I will be **restored** to you.

Additional Greetings

²³Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends you greetings, ²⁴as do Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke, my fellow workers.

²⁵The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.^b
